Top 3 Reasons Why You Need the RSV Vaccine

1 Respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) can be dangerous for babies and young children. RSV illness is the most common reason that babies are hospitalized in the United States.

2 Getting the RSV vaccine during pregnancy helps protect your newborn from RSV right after birth and for the first 6 months of life.

3 The RSV vaccine is safe for both you and your fetus.



You can get the RSV vaccine if you will be 32 to 36 weeks pregnant between September and January. The Pfizer Abrysvo vaccine is the only RSV vaccine approved for use in pregnancy.
